

## Editorial

### NEGATIVE BRAINS IN SANCHAR BHAVAN

The 14 storey skyscraper Sanchar Bhavan in New Delhi has many chambers. A bureaucrat sitting in one of such chambers was so impudent to state that he puts all requests on pension revision of BSNL/MTNL retirees in dustbin. He gets huge salary, as revised with 7th CPC fitment benefits, to do so.

On 24-8-2014, we submitted a memorandum to 7th CPC. The chairman of CPC, Justice (Retd.) Mr. A K Mathur, stated that we had a *prima facie*. In March 2015 Ms. Meena Agarwal, Secretary to 7th CPC informed us that CPC sought views of DoT on that memorandum. Though the letter from CPC reached Sanchar Bhavan on 5-1-2015, the 'big baboos' kept it in the dustbin for 8 months. We pointed it out to the then Secretary, Telecom Mr. R. K, Garg on 4-8-2015. Thereafter the dustbin baboos sent the views of DoT to CPC on 16-8-2015. But, the time limit was over and hence the 'views' went to the dustbin of CPC office. Now, these baboos of Sanchar Bhavan, who killed the matter, ask: "*Where is recommendation from CPC on your pension revision?*" They get huge salary to ask such dumb questions.

AUAB rightly demanded delinking pension revision from pay revision in BSNL. During discussion on 3-12-2018, the 'big baboos' in DoT informed the Minister that they had already taken up the matter of delinking with DoP&PW. So the Minister assured that it would be expedited. But the 'wisemen' in Sanchar Bhavan chambers deliberately sent a half cooked stuff to DoP&PW expecting a negative reply from DoP&PW. Now, DoP&PW has sent the File back to DoT asking to resubmit it with concrete proposal how the pension would be revised after delinking. Officers in DoP&PW say that they have not rejected the proposal but the 'big baboos' in Sanchar Bhavan say that it is 'virtually rejected'. They misguided the Minister. They try to misguide all. They will get huge salary for it.

We hope that Smt. Aruna Sundararajan, an efficient IAS Officer, and the Minister will understand what is being cooked in Sanchar Bhavan chambers and come to the rescue of BSNL retirees who toiled and developed Indian Telecom infrastructure that gave a profit of Rs 10,000 Crore per year to the BSNL. Such people do not deserve the humiliation after retirement.

### CWC meeting:

DG, our senior Vice President though started from his house developed some uneasiness before reaching railway station in Chennai. Immediately he was taken to hospital for check up. ### POST CARD CAMPAIGN

Based on the feedback from Circle Secretaries it is assessed that more than 35400 post cards were sent to the PM by our comrades. Adding the number from CBMPA constituents, it is more than 45000. I profusely congratulate all our comrades for enthusiastic and prompt response to the call.

### Decisions/Resolutions

Important decisions taken by CWC are given in Page 6 of this issue and hence not repeated here. CWC adopted few resolutions as:

a) Demand the Minister for Communication to honour his assurance given to AUAB that pension revision would be delinked from pay revision in BSNL.

b) Demand the DoT to resubmit the File on delinking to DoP&PW with concrete proposal on pension revision as required by DoP&PW, without further delay.

c) Release sufficient funds to clear all pending bills and pay in full the quarterly allowance under BSNLMRS.

d) DoT should pay the premium to CGHS, as one time measure, so that the pensioners can migrate from MRS to CGHS.

Since many of the pensioners are residing in areas not covered by CGHS at present, CGHS Wellness Centres should be opened in all remaining districts headquarters in the country.

e) Augment staff in CCA offices to launch the CPMS effectively and within the time frame.

f) Start Pension Adalat at the national level for sorting out issues related to BSNL pension.

g) Thanking the Bangalore TD Unit of NFTE-BSNL for providing the space free, to function our CHQ office.

# KANYAKUMARI CWC MEETING

## A BRIEF REPORT

The Central Working Committee of AIBSNLPWA met in Kanyakumari on 13th and 14th February 2019 without any formal inauguration or any Open Session; to save time for discussing very seriously certain issues and organizational task to march ahead to the new heights. We met in CWC to review our work during the last nine and a half years. We met to assess if we had done justice to our solemn declaration made on 20th August 2009 launching this organization that “we shall work to protect and safeguard the interest of entire BSNL pensioners in the country, without any political, regional, communal or cadre bias and that we shall work unitedly irrespective of the organizations with which we had association while we were in service.” It was a clear conscious statement.

We had launched this organization because;

■ In 2006, the 6th CPC was appointed. There was nobody to raise our problem before the CPC.  
■ In 2008 September, the Government issued orders implementing 6th CPC report on pension revision. But, BSNL pensioners did not get any benefit. There was none to plead for us then. ■ In 2008 February, 50% IDA was merged in PSU, but it was not given to pensioners. BSNL staff unions naturally fought for employees, nobody talked about pensioners. ■ On 26-11-2008, the DPE issued order on pay revision for PSU Executives. On 5-3-2009, BSNL endorsed that order. But retired executives were not given any benefit. ■ In 2009 itself negotiations were commenced on wage revision for the Non-Executives in BSNL. None raised the demand for pension revision in BSNL at that time.

**WE LAUNCHED AIBSNLPWA ON 20-8-2009 AND STARTED OUR STRUGGLES.**

◆ We achieved Pension Revision on 15-3-2011, first instant in Central PSUs. ◆ On 8-7-2011, the new order for full Pension on completion of 10 years was got extended to BSNL retirees. Simultaneously we achieved pension @ 50% of Last Pay Drawn for BSNL retirees also. There was nobody else to raise these demands. ◆ We demanded and achieved two family pensions for Ex Servicemen re-employed in BSNL. ◆ MRS was first denied to spouses of pensioners. We struggled and got it. ◆ BSNL agreed to allot Staff Quarters to pensioners on our demand. ◆ We achieved concession on BSNL Broadband connections to pensioners. ◆ The new order granting family pension to unmarried daughters/divorced daughters etc. without any age limit was got extended to BSNL also. ◆ Favourable order on deferred option cases is yet another achievement of AIBSNLPWA. ◆ When serving staff got the benefit of 78.2% IDA in pay revision in June 2013, ‘leaders’ kept mum when DoT deleted the sentence regarding pensioners in the agreement. We had to struggle for about three years to get it. ◆ The particular Clause in Rule 37A on sharing the pension liability between the Government and BSNL was annulled because of conscious demand AIBSNLPWA placed and struggled for.

**These are undeniable facts, notwithstanding the false claims by some people who never thought of these issues. Formation of AIBSNLPWA was a historic requirement. Struggles launched by this organization and the victory are unique and spectacular..**

We started the journey in 2009 with ZERO membership. Today, we have more than 42000 Life members and more than 25,000 annual members on role.

We have created a history. We move further to create new history. Formation of CBMPA, an umbrella organization of all associations of BSNL/MTNL retirees in November 2018 is another great leap in our journey. We shall strengthen CBMPA and we shall march ahead shoulder to shoulder with all the right thinking organizations of BSNL/MTNL retirees.

#### AT KANYAKUMARI

The meeting was held in Vivekananda Kendra, Kanyakumari. Com. Ramankutty, assisted by Com. A Chellaiah (DS Nagercoil) and a team of 14 comrades from Nagercoil SSA unit made all arrangements for boarding and lodging in the Vivekananda Kendra compound itself which was appreciated by all who attended the meeting. Some of the CHQ office-bearers and Circle Secretaries could not attend it due to illness. Com. DG developed some health problem on his way from his house in Chennai to Railway station. He had to be admitted in hospital. Similarly Comrades A Sugumaran (VP), A Sudhakara Rao (VP), H S Prasad (AGS), Jagdir Singh (AGS), S R Dutta (OS), B P S Chouhan (CS CGT), J S Malik (CS HR), R N Singh (CS JKD), Murshid Ali (CS Kolkata TF) and Gautam Kailash (CS UPW) also could reach due to personal reasons.

CWC meeting paid rich tributes to Shri H N Ananthkumar, former minister, Com. George Fernandez, Com. P C Moitra and others.

#### IMPORTANT DECISIONS

**CWC declared full support and solidarity to the serving staff and their unions in their efforts to get a reasonable and decent wage revision. CWC called upon branches to extend all possible help and support wherever possible.**

**Based on information received through whatsapp, CWC felt that the AUAB may be**

**forced to make some understanding for pay revision with 0% or 5% fitment and such an understanding between BSNL company and the staff unions in no way is binding on pension revision which is an entirely different issue to be decided by the Department of Telecom. Hence, we shall continue vigorously our efforts to get pension revision with CPC fitment benefits. No benefit shall come to us automatically or as Grace.**

**CWC authorized the CHQ Secretariat to take appropriate action at the appropriate time to realize our just demand for pension revision. Though it is time consuming and costly, legal remedy can also be considered as the last resort.**

**CWC called upon branches to approach MPs and enlist their support to our efforts and demand. Efforts may be made to submit the memorandum on our demand to the Prime Minister whenever he visits different places during election campaign.**

**CWC directed the CHQ to hold a National Convention of BSNL/MTNL pensioners in New Delhi in consultation with CBMPA constituents. Efforts should be made to ensure participation of leaders of all central trade unions in the Convention.**

**CWC expressed its anger and anguish over the most negative and recalcitrant attitude of bureaucrats in DoT explicitly expressed by not submitting concrete proposal on pension revision as required by the Department of Pension & Pensioners Welfare.**

**[Decisions taken on organizational matters and the resolutions adopted by CWC on other issues like MRS, CGHS, CCA office staffing etc. will be circulated through the next Circular from CHQ.]**

# SAMPANN

## NEW SYSTEM FOR ACCOUNTING AND MANAGEMENT OF PENSION FOR BSNL/DOT PENSIONERS LAUNCHED ON 29-12-2018 BY THE HON'BLE PRIME MINISTER OF INDIA

**SAMPANN** is an initiative undertaken by the Controller General of Communication Accounts (CGCA), Department of Telecommunications.


**SAMPANN** or "System for Accounting and Management of Pension" is the brand name for Comprehensive Pension Management System(CPMS)

**SAMPANN** aims to establish a seamless pension processing system which would bring the processing, sanctioning, authorization and payment under a common platform.

### for New Retirees of BSNL

o Interim Process till onboarding of BSNL: The current practice of manual filling of physical forms by retiree and submitting to BSNL offices will continue which, the HoO (BSNL) will forward to the CCA along with the form 7 and other papers for processing through Sampann. This will eventually be replaced with online filling of forms by the retirees once the HoO (BSNL) initiates online processing and forwarding of cases to CCA offices.

**Digital Profile:** All physical forms received will be updated digitally in Sampann, to create



digital records and extend online facilities and SMS alerts for the pensioners.

**Timely Updates and tracking:** Pensioners will get updates regarding the progress of the case via Mail and SMS once the pension case is captured on Sampann.

**Digital ePPO:** Once the pension is sanctioned, the digitally signed PPO and Authority for Payment of Death-cum-retirement Gratuity will be generated and made available in the Dashboard of the Pensioner for printing if required.

**Handing over of PPO:** A hard copy of the PPO shall be sent by Post to the pensioner. This will replace the earlier Embossed seal PPO. The payment will be disbursed to the mandated Bank account.

**There will be no requirement to come to the CCA in person to collect the PPO, unlike the earlier system where pensioners were expected to visit the Bank to collect the PPO and receive the first pension in person.**

**Regular and Timely Payment:** The calculation of monthly pension, Arrears, TDS etc. will be processed by the CCA offices. To be informed about the latest status, Pensioners can check their monthly statement in their account at dotpension.gov.in or the Sampann website.

**Income Tax:** Pensioners are to submit the savings declaration through Post to the CCA offices. The concerned CCA will dispatch the Form 16 by post to the pensioner's declared address.

**Grievance Redressal:** In case a pensioner has any query, grievance etc. the same can be registered and tracked by the pensioner via CPMS website/mobile app. Alternately the

Pensioner can always call the national Helpline or mail his grievances/query to [sampann.cpms-dot@nic.in](mailto:sampann.cpms-dot@nic.in).

**for DOT/BSNL Pensioners whose pension is processed by the CPPCs/banks and HPO/Post offices**

There will be no changes for the Telecom Pensioners drawing pension from Banks/ Post offices and they will continue in the current system till orders for migration is issued.

**Proper intimation and assistance:** The existing pensioners will be migrated to the new system in the new financial year followed by announcements and proper intimations.

**Digital Profile:** Once migration is done in coordination with the banks, their profile will be created on CPMS.

**Least disruption:** Even after migration, the payment will continue to be made in the same Bank account as was done in earlier system.

**Regular and timely payment:** The calculation of monthly pension, Arrears, TDS will be processed by the concerned CCA office. Pensioners can check the monthly ledger on the Dashboard as well.

**Income Tax:** Pensioners are to submit the saving declarations by sending it by Post to the CCA offices. Form 16 shall be provided to the pensioner by CCA office by post as well.

**Grievance Redressal:** In case a pensioner has any query, grievance etc. the same can be registered and tracked by the pensioner via CPMS website or mobile app. Alternately the Pensioner can always call the national Helpline or mail his grievances/query to [sampann.cpms-dot@nic.in](mailto:sampann.cpms-dot@nic.in)

## DEBATE ON PENSION REVISION IN BSNL/MTNL

Broadly there are two schools of thought:

1. Pension Revision will be carried out giving effect from 1.1.2017, following Wage Revision as per 3<sup>rd</sup> PRC
2. Pension Revision should be delinked from Wage Revision as the disbursing authority for pension is different from that for wages and thereby, pension revision will be carried out as per CPC but on ID pay scales, date of effect being 1.1.2017.

UNITED FORUM OF MTNL UNIONS AND ASSOCIATIONS, DELHI belongs to the 2<sup>nd</sup> category. Why? Let me explain:-

Those who advocate for 1<sup>st</sup> category pension revision pin their justifications broadly on the following points:-

- (1) Pension Revision as per 3<sup>rd</sup> PRC following Wage Revision will be comparatively easier to achieve.
- (2) This will keep the pensioners close to the working employees as the interest of both groups so far as revision of wage/pension is concerned, will rest on one common fulcrum.
- (3) It will be loss for both employees and pensioners if we invite CDA pay scales and CD Allowance in the process because CDA pay scales are normally less than IDA pay scales and CD Allowances are normally granted after interval of 6 months unlike IDA for which interval is 3 months.
- (4) They are dismayed when they apprehend that if the hard-earned IDA pay scales are sacrificed, the fruits of consistent struggles to achieve IDA scales at the time of absorption will go waste.
- (5) They refer the issue of MTNL pensions stating that Government agreed to take the responsibility /liability of MTNL pension

(combined services) only when their pension is calculated on the basis of equivalent BSNL pay scales.

### My comments:

- (1) It is not difficult to comprehend that if pension revision depends on pay revision as per PRC, there is no certainty whether pension revision will at all be carried out. Pay Revision as per PRC is subjected to a number of obnoxious clauses. There are fair amount of chances that pay revision may not take place. If at all pay revision takes place, there remains the question: to what extent the pay will be revised. Thus pension revision following pay revision as per PRC is not secured and not uniform.
- (2) When I say so, I don't underestimate the strength of the unions and associations. We must be pragmatic enough to understand that all constraints cannot be done away with fully (and always) with the fighting strength of the unions. There are other factors involved.
- (3) Due to this uncertainty, even DOT feels (subjected to be approval of nodal ministries/ departments) pension revision should be delinked from pay revision. DOT feels, pay revision is uncertain under certain situation, but pension revision cannot be resisted for long. For pay revision, MTNL/BSNL will have to pay from their earnings, but pension & pension revision is the liability of DOT/Govt.
- (4) Then there is a contention that CPC is only for CG employees and CG pensioners who are linked to CDA pay scales and not for those who are on ID pay scales or retired from ID pay scales. This statement is only partially true because a number of our pensionary claims of ID pensioners are settled on the basis of recommendations of CPC and for this, we need not sacrifice either ID pay scales or IDA. Only

the issue of pension revision is left. Had we overwhelmed ourselves with such poor convictions at the time of absorption, we could not have achieved pension from DOT/ Governmental civil estimates.

(5) If CPC is for CD pensioners' pension revision, then what is there for the pension revision of ID pensioners? Fact is that neither the CPC Report nor the orders issued thereon by Department of Pension & Pensioners Welfare talks of CDA pensioners or IDA pensioners. All the orders issued by DoP&PW implementing the CPC recommendations from time to time state that they are applicable to all Pensioners and family Pensioners covered under CCS (Pension) Rule, 1972. BSNL/MTNL pensioners are covered under the said rule. PRC does not deal with pension revision in that sense. So we demand: let there be CPC guidelines to apply for ID pension like ours.

(6) Then there is a fear that if we press for CPC, then pension will be calculated on equivalent CD pay scales. Just to bring home this fear, the example of MTNL pension is wrongly pointed out stating that MTNL pension is calculated on BSNL pay scales. The statement is, at the least, confusing. MTNL pensioners are now getting pension from DOT and that too on MTNL pay scales. Com. V A N Namboodiri should know this as I thankfully acknowledge that he was closely associated with us in that struggle and made valuable contributions. MTNL pays to DOT only pension contribution on MTNL's ID pay scale as BSNL pays the same on its own ID pay scale. Beyond that MTNL does not (or, not in a position to) pay.

(7) I consciously avoid bringing MTNL matter into discussion at this stage to avoid avoidable confusions in this debate. Because DOT's present proposal for delinking is only for BSNL. Why to bring MTNL matters at this stage?

(8) It is no body's contention to plead for CD pay scale & CD allowances. We should not play this as a ghost in the dark room. Ghost can

be tackled appropriately when confronted in actuality.

(9) One important aspect of CGHS entitlement of BSNL/MTNL pensioners is being lost sight of. Initially the entitlement of CGHS for BSNL/MTNL pensioners was denied on the ground that they are ID pensioners. But Government had to concede the fact that BSNL/MTNL pensioners draw the pension from the same civil estimates as the CD pensioners do. Thus BSNL/MTNL pensioners are made entitled to CGHS benefits as CD pensioners. Please note that BSNL/MTNL employees are not entitled for this, as their wages are not paid from civil estimates of Govt. of India. The amount of one time contributions for life time CGHS benefits of BSNL/MTNL pensioners were calculated keeping their ID pay scales into account. This may be a good pointer in the direction of ID pensioners to get pay revision as per CPC even though pension contributions calculated ID pay scales.

(10) Then on the question of "easily achievable", some feel that pension revision following PRC can be achieved easily. If so, why it is not possibly done so during last 2 years. Moreover, we want easy solution or permanent solution?

(11) My point is why to burden ourselves by anticipating what Govt. may say or may not? Why to take the side of Govt. to plead what are the problems on Govt side? Let us leave those to the Govt. at this stage. Let us concentrate on what should be our DEMAND that, on achievement, will solve our problem fully and once for all. If our pension revision is a knotty issue, who is responsible for this? We need not be apologetic or unduly defensive to put up our right DEMAND.

## **Subscribers to the Patrika, please note:**

**LIFE Members and LIFE Subscribers:** There is a misunderstanding in the mind of some comrades. Life member of the Association and Life subscriber to the Patrika are quite different. If someone pays Rs 1000 to the branch and becomes a Life Member of the Association, the branch remits only Rs 200 of it as CHQ Quota. With Rs 200 once received we cannot supply the Patrika to such Life members for their life time. If anyone wants to get the Patrika for life time, another Rs 1000 has to be paid. Entire amount of that Rs. 1000 (Patrika subscription) should be sent to CHQ as branch has no expenditure on the journal.

*From January, 2019 onwards the Life time subscription is Rs 1000 per copy and for Annual Subscription it is Rs. 100 per copy. Please enroll Life subscribers as far as possible. Kanyakumari CWC considered some options like reducing pages by avoiding printing lists of Life Members, avoiding the colour pages etc. But some CWC members did not favour such options.*

I prepare most of the matter appearing in this Patrika. I type all the items. I read the proof - first one, second and third one also. Then, after making the page layout and converting into pdf format I send it as email to the printing press at Chennai. As such, I need not read it again. But, I know well that I need not be the Editor all the time. Even after relieving myself from the post I must read it. So I became a Life Subscriber paying the required amount. One copy comes to me by post from Chennai. Normally, speed post reaches the very next day. Ordinary mail takes 4 or 5 days. But my copy of last issue of the Patrika posted in Chennai RMS office on 7th January 2019 reached me at Trivandrum on 30th January 2019. This is the postal service. As Journals are unregistered articles there is no record and nobody responds to any complaint. This is a general complaint with regard to all journals and periodicals using *Indiapost*. We are helpless.

**ON RETIRAL BENEFITS AS PER CPC CEPORT  
TO THOSE WHO RETIRED ON 31-12-2015**

The Apex Court, in S. Banerjee Vs UoI, AIR 1990 SC 295, ruled **“it has to be said that the petitioner had retired on January 1, 1986 and not on December 31, 1985. In the circumstances, the petitioner comes within the purview of paragraph 17.3 of the recommendations of the Pay Commission”.** *This judgement has attained finality and thus holds the field today.* Even though UoI represented by Secretary, DoP&PW argued that the Apex Court judgement is applicable only to those who voluntarily retired on 1<sup>st</sup> January and not for those who retired on 31<sup>st</sup> December on superannuation, Hon. High Courts of Kerala, Andhra & Karnataka did not accept that arguments but gave relief to the petitioners. In UoI & Ors Vs P.S.R. Kumar Sinha & Anr (2006(2)ALT 354:2006(3)ALD 57 Hon Andhra High Court stated in para 6.17 **“When the employee has retired on the last date of the month, his date of retirement has to be treated as 1<sup>st</sup> date of succeeding month”.**

Very recently CAT, Principal Bench New Delhi in OA No. 571/2017 gave a judgement which was pronounced on 17/04/2018 sanctioned relief to the petitioner Shri G.C. Yadav who retired on superannuation on 31/12/2015 and whose date of birth was 1/1/1956 and directed the respondents to fix the retiral benefits of the applicant in accordance with the 7<sup>th</sup> CPC recommendations which have been implemented vide OM & resolution dated 4/8/2016 in respect of pensioners retiring on or after 1/1/2016.

**It has become the law of the land. So, please don't force the pensioners to resort to prolonged litigation. It is nothing but wastage of time of honourable courts and unnecessary expenditure to the exchequer. We request you, sir, to issue a general order for getting the retiral benefits, particularly gratuity ceiling, of 7<sup>th</sup> CPC recommendations for those who retired on 31/12/2015, including BSNL IDA pensioners.**

**ON SWITCHING OVER TO CGHS**

We called on you, madam, on 20-11-2018 evening to discuss about the inordinate delay in making payment to pensioners under BSNLMRS. You were kind enough to explain the financial difficulties faced by BSNL and nobody is lending a helping hand You advised us to tell the pensioners to switch over to CGHS. When we pointed out that CGHS facility is available only in 26 cities and not everywhere you suggested that at least in those cities 26 cities let the pensioners get the medical facility. Then we pointed out that most of the pen-

sioners are not in a position to make one-time lumpsum payment to CGHS and wait for reimbursement from BSNL.

We suggested that BSNL can make one time lumpsum payment directly to CGHS. If that suggestion is accepted then we can request the pensioners to switch over to CGHS in those 26 cities. The financial burden of BSNL on MRS would also drastically reduce. Hope BSNL would take a positive decision in this regard sooner than later.
